Public Works

Main Street & 10th Street Improvement Project Update

Significant progress has been made on the Main Street & 10th Street Improvements Project since the last update. On Thursday, March 6, 2025, the contractor successfully completed roadway paving for the roundabout and additional paving on North 10th Street between Main Street and Riverfront Road and along Riverfront Road from

10th Street to the end of the road. Due to forecasted inclement weather, the contractor worked extended hours, completing all milling and paving activities in just one and a half days instead of the originally scheduled three days. In addition, most of the new signage has been installed, and Main Street was reopened to both eastbound and westbound traffic following the completion of the paving work.

To prepare for paving, the contractor completed the installation of all curb and gutter systems, the truck apron at the center of the roundabout, curbing for the splitter islands, and the roadway subgrade and aggregate base course. Other completed work includes the installation of a new catch basin, sidewalk grading, driveway, ramp installation, and the lighting conduit. The sidewalk and ramp installation on the northeast corner have also been finished.

Looking ahead, the upcoming work will involve completing the installation of signage, stamped colored concrete in the splitter islands, additional ramps, sidewalks, and driveways, and the placement of landscape rock.
