Police Department Attends Technology Summit in Atlanta, Georgia

Earlier this week, Communications Center Manager Alexis James and Commander Gareth Braxton were invited

to attend a technology summit in Atlanta, Georgia, along with dozens of other law enforcement leaders from around the state. The summit focused on technology advancements, real-time crime centers (RTCCs), drone deployments, and artificial intelligence (AI). They also had a chance to tour the Dunwoody Police Department's RTCC, to see how it might be scaled to the Cottonwood and Verde Valley region. The Cottonwood Police Department has solicited grant funding to aid in acquiring and implementing some of this technology. One of the department's key strategic directions is to "Advance Technology Solutions."

NARTA, located on the Yavapai College Prescott Campus, is a regional training center serving city, county, tribal, and state law enforcement agencies throughout Arizona since 1996. The academy offers a rigorous 21-week basic training program with over 800 hours of instruction.
