Last week, the Cottonwood Police Department received a new mobile surveillance trailer. This overtly visible

trailer will be deployed throughout the City to safeguard critical infrastructure, public events, and private businesses while deterring and addressing unwanted activity. The system includes remotely operated cameras and motion detection capabilities. Similar systems are commonly found at construction sites and large retail or convenience stores across the state. This trailer was purchased with a grant from the Arizona Department of Homeland Security. A special thanks goes to Lisa Lau for her significant assistance with the procurement process!

Safety Daze 2025 – Wrap-Up

Safety Daze 2025 was a successful undertaking. Our goal is to offer material relevant to the workplace, but also interesting and helpful outside of work. This year, classes included Stop the Bleed, CPR Quick Course, Heat Stress, Fire Extinguisher, Situational Awareness & Active Shooter, Ergonomics 101 (provided by Southwest Risk), and Desert Safety (provided by Phoenix Herpetological Sanctuary). The most attended courses were the mandatory classes; however, the other offerings were well received. The total number of participants was up 30% from last year. Thank you for making it a success for all those who attended classes.

In addition to the classes, a Games Packet was provided to challenge our knowledge of safety information. The idea is to foster some discussion and collaboration to assist with the successful completion of the packets. A special shout-out to Parks & Rec is in order. They had an intra-department challenge to attend all classes. Creating a little competition often drives results. Several employees were successful in that effort; however, not all of them completed the Games Packet.

Employees who attended the two mandatory classes and one voluntary class and turned in their "completed" game packet were deemed eligible for participation prizes. Each eligible person received a consolation prize of a glass breaker/seat belt cutter. In addition, they would qualify for the drawing for the first, second, and third prizes.
