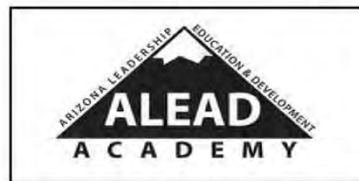


## 16<sup>th</sup> Annual Arizona Leadership, Education and Development Academy

Last week Commander Braxton, along with officers and agents from the Prescott, Maricopa, Apache Junction, Surprise, and Northern Arizona University Police Departments, and FBI participated in the 16<sup>th</sup> Annual Arizona Leadership, Education and Development Academy otherwise known as ALEAD for a weeklong instruction course for high school-aged children to learn more about leadership and civic engagement. ### Extreme Heat Warning & Near-Critical Fire Weather Conditions - Thursday PM Update

#### KEY POINTS

- Warmer and drier conditions expected through the rest of the week and into early next week.
- Dangerously hot temperatures possible in the lower elevations of the Grand Canyon this weekend.
- Near-critical fire weather conditions are possible on Thursday and then again on Monday with breezy afternoon winds.

- Upgraded Extreme Heat Watch to an Extreme Heat Warning.

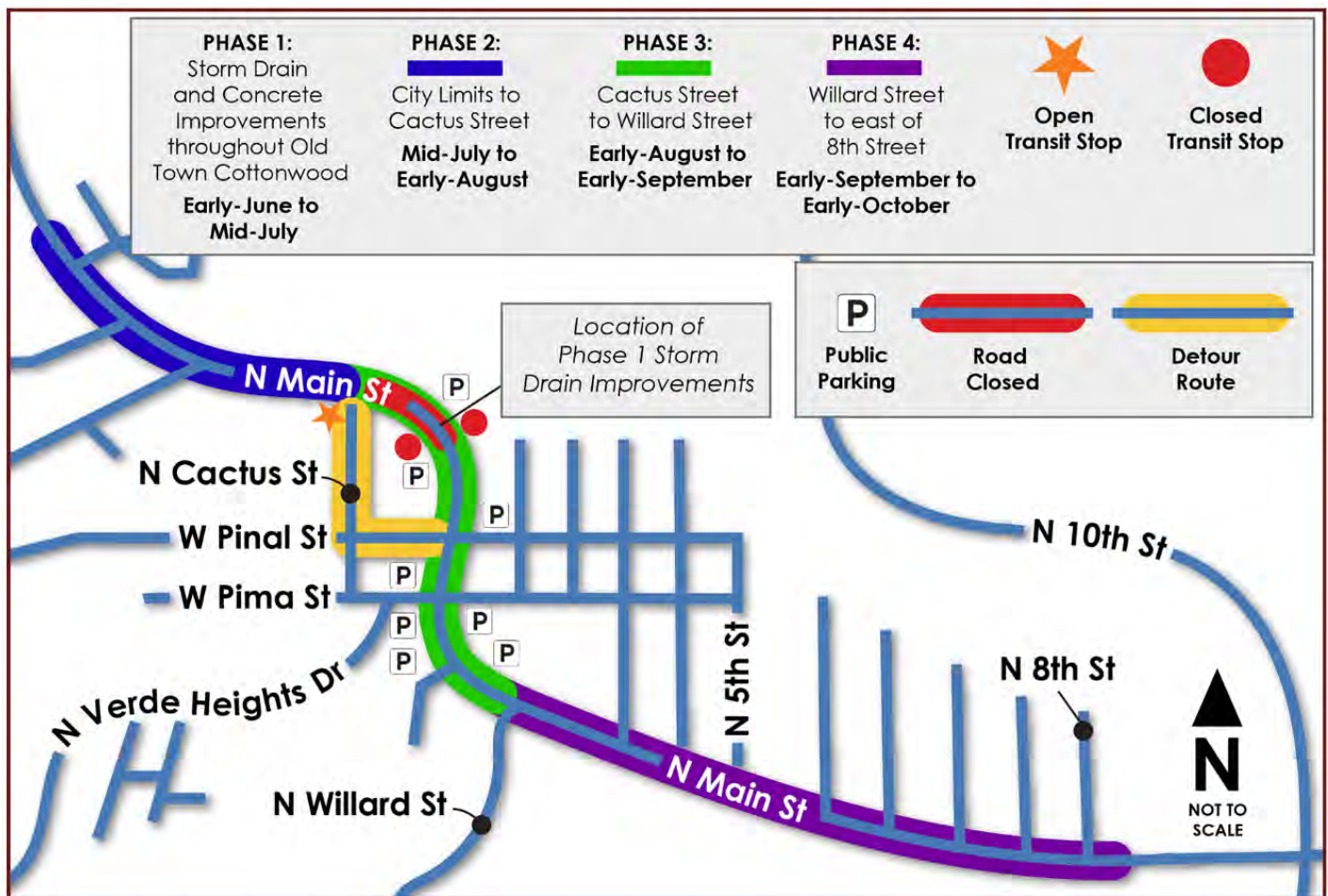
## Public Works

### Phase 1 of the Main Street Improvements Project – Portion of Main Street to be closed

On Monday, June 9, 2025, crews began constructing Phase 1 of the Main Street Improvements Project. Phase 1 will commence with storm drain improvements along Main Street (between Cactus Street and Yavapai Street) and concrete improvements as needed throughout all stages. This work will require a full road closure of Main Street to pedestrians and vehicles (as shown on the map), which will be in effect 24 hours a day until Phase 1 is complete in mid-July. Please follow the marked signage to get to your destination.

Work will occur Monday through Friday, from 5:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. Public parking lots and businesses will remain open and accessible throughout the construction. Various transit stops will be closed within Old Town during construction. Passengers are advised to use the open transit stop at Cactus Street and Main Street.

This training session is for anyone in the building community as it is designed to provide an overview of the key updates to the 2024 International Residential Code, revisions to the International Fire Code as they pertain to one- and two-family dwellings, and a review of the new fee schedules and local Code amendments.

The City of Cottonwood administrative offices will be closed on Thursday, June 19, 2025, in observance of Juneteenth.

The Cottonwood Public Library will be closed on June 19, 2025, and reopen on June 20, 2025, at 9:00 a.m.

The Cottonwood Municipal Court will be closed on June 19, 2025, and reopen on June 20, 2025, at 8:00 a.m.

The Cottonwood Recreation Center will remain open on Juneteenth and operate during regular business hours. The outdoor pool will also operate during regular hours: lap swim from 10:00 a.m. to 12:00 p.m., recreation swim from 12:00 to 4:00 p.m., and evening lap swim from 4:00 to 6:00 p.m. Group exercise classes (indoors and outdoors) will be canceled on June 19, 2025, in observance of the holiday.

Cottonwood Area Transit (CAT) will not offer regular bus service on June 19, 2025. The Verde Shuttle will operate regular bus service on all routes on that day. The CAT administrative offices will be closed on June 19, 2025, and reopen on Friday, June 20, 2025, at 8:00 a.m.

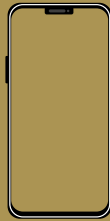
