Key principles of these care systems emphasize evidence-based guidelines, performance measurement, gap identification, and engagement in quality improvement efforts.

Public Works

Main Street Improvements Project

Phase 1: Drainage and Pedestrian Improvements

Since mobilizing on June 9, 2025, Combs Construction Company has made substantial progress on Phase 1 of

the Main Street Improvements Project. The contractor has successfully installed the new storm drain system along Main Street, between Cactus Street and Yavapai Street in Old Town. Pedestrian improvements are now substantially complete. These enhancements include ADA-compliant upgrades to existing sidewalks and ramps, the construction of new ramp "bump outs" in Old Town, and safety and accessibility improvements in front of Strada and Bocce. Main Street is scheduled to fully reopen to both vehicular and pedestrian traffic on Friday, June 27, 2025. The contractor is currently ahead of schedule. No work is planned during the week of June 30, 2025, in observance of the Independence Day holiday. The remaining pedestrian improvements on Main Street, between Willard Street and Balboa Street, are scheduled to resume on July 7, 2025.



Phase 2: Roadway Reconstruction

Phase 2 of the project, which includes roadway reconstruction from the north city limits to Cactus Street, is scheduled to begin the evening of Sunday, July 13, 2025. Construction activities will operate on a 24/7 schedule to expedite completion. Main Street will remain open during this phase to minimize disruption, with traffic managed through the work zone using a pilot car. Groseta Ranch Road and On the Greens Boulevard will be closed to non-emergency vehicles for the duration of

Phase 2 work.

Their swift actions resulted in the gentleman being alert, stable, and communicative as he was transported from the Recreation Center to the hospital. We're pleased to share that the latest update indicates the gentleman has since been released from the hospital.

Situations like this underscore the critical importance of the training we make available to all staff members. We are deeply grateful to have such skilled and dedicated individuals working for the City. Their actions reflect the very best of our City team.
