## **Public Works**

#### Main Street Improvements Project

Work activities on the Main Street Improvements Project are scheduled to resume the evening of Sunday, July 13, 2025. Combs Construction will start work on Phase 2 of the project, which consists of utility adjustments, asphalt milling and removal, roadway excavation, subgrade preparation, and paving between Cactus Street and the north City limit. Paving work on this segment is scheduled to be completed by Sunday, July 20, 2025, weather dependent. The contractor will also be constructing the new ramp at the southwest corner of Main Street and Cactus Street.

The contractor will be working 24 hours a day in order to expedite the completion of this phase. As the contractor performs work on Phase 2, one-way traffic will be maintained on Main Street between Cactus Street and the north City limit. Main Street traffic will be controlled with flaggers, and vehicles will be escorted through the work zone via a pilot car. Groseta Ranch Road will be closed at the intersection with Main Street, and On the Greens Boulevard will be closed at the intersection with Main Street as work is completed on this phase. A detour route for Groseta Ranch Road traffic will be in place using SR-89A to Mingus Avenue to Willard Street to Main Street.

On Sunday, July 20, 2025, the contractor will begin work on Phase 3 between Cactus Street and the north side of the intersection with Pima Street. Work activities on this segment will consist of asphalt milling and removal, roadway excavation, subgrade preparation, and paving. Work on this phase is scheduled to be completed on Saturday, July 26, 2025, weather dependent. Phase 3 work activities will be performed at night between the hours of 8:00 p.m. and 7:00 a.m. to minimize impacts to Old Town businesses and visitors. Main Street will be closed between Cactus Street and Pima Street, and Main Street traffic will be detoured using Pima Street and Cactus Street. City staff and Beta Public Relations will continue outreach and coordination efforts with Old Town businesses before the start of work on this phase.
