Main Street Improvements Project


Combs Construction Co. continues to make excellent progress on the Main Street Improvements Project. During the past two weeks, Combs Construction Co. completed paving in Old Town between Cactus Street and Willard Street on Saturday, July 26, 2025. Work on the drainage improvements at Main Street and Cactus Street was completed on July 29, 2025.

On Monday, August 4, 2025, the contractor continued asphalt removal and roadway excavation on Main Street between Willard Street and 10th Street, completing this work the evening of August 7, 2025. The contractor will complete grading and subgrade preparation work by Friday, August 8, 2025, and work on the remaining ADA concrete improvements will also be completed by Friday, August 8, 2025.

The final segment of Main Street between Willard Street and 10th Street is scheduled to be paved by Monday, August 11, 2025. After the paving work is completed, Main Street will reopen to through traffic. After completing paving, the contractor will begin work on utility adjustments the evening of Wednesday, August 13, 2025, and is scheduled to complete this work by Tuesday, August 19, 2025. Project cleanup will be ongoing.
