# **Cottonwood Area Transit**

## Daily Service Operations Report

On June 3, 2025, the service demonstrated strong performance in meeting demand, achieving a 100% met demand rate for 132.7 passengers. This marks our highest one-day demand since before the COVID-19 pandemic. However, the completion rate was approximately 71.27%, with 94 rides successfully completed out of a total due to 38.7 rider cancellations. Six drivers were utilized to accommodate the demand. Key operational metrics include 47 rides, all of which were round-trip, resulting in 94 actual trips. The net driver hours totaled 48.4, with a utilization rate of 2.2. Productivity was solid at 2.4 completed rides per vehicle revenue hour, supported by 38.5 vehicle revenue hours. Geographical demand was concentrated in the City of Cottonwood, with contributions from surrounding areas. Overall, the day reflected efficient demand fulfillment.


